Seniors Outreach Program

During this past year Silver Threads Service and James Bay New Horizons worked in partnership on a 2nd phase of the Outreach Program designed to connect seniors to their neighbours, provide them with community resources and to give them a forum for discussion about what is working well in their lives and what is not.

Jo-Anne Silverman, was hired as the Outreach Worker and she focused on neighbourhoods in Saanich and Victoria, and hosted Apartment Coffee Chats for seniors 55+ living in rental housing. Connections were made with over 300 seniors living in a total of 64 rental apartments in Saanich (23 buildings) and Victoria (41 buildings).

Overriding themes remained consistent in most visits and participants were open and forthcoming about the issues they are most concerned about, that include:

- Cost of living and high rents
- High cost of food, prescription drugs
- High cost of transportation
- Lack of family physicians
- Loneliness
- Pervasive illness

We plan to continue this important work in the future, and thank Jo-Anne for her dedication and hard work. Funding for this program was provided by the City of Victoria Strategic Planning Grant and the Provincial Government.

Six Job Search Tips for Mature Workers

1. **Network, network, network:** Not surprisingly, many job leads come from friends, family or colleagues. Share with everyone in your personal and professional networks that you are searching for employment.
2. **Focus on Experience, Not Age.** Fight negative age stereotypes by focusing on your knowledge and real-world experience. Take pride in your achievements, maturity, and wisdom.
3. **Consider a Career Change.** Many older people find meaningful work consulting for businesses (particularly small businesses) in their area of expertise.
4. **Be Confident – but not too much.** Don't be shy about a little self-promotion. Tell employers what your strengths are and how they will benefit by hiring you
5. **Be Patient.** While finding a job can be hard work at any age, older workers need to be even more patient and diligent.
6. **Flash the Smart Phone.** Older workers often get a bad rap for their unwillingness or inability to adapt to change – particularly when it comes to technology.
