Connecting With Isolated Seniors in Victoria

Silver Threads Service is working together with James Bay New Horizons Society and recently received funding from the City of Victoria to pilot an important project involving isolated seniors. This involves an Outreach Worker who will connect with seniors living in apartment buildings in the Jubilee and James Bay neighbourhoods - making connections, listening about concerns and informing seniors of available services to help them remain

independent. The project will run until the end of December.

Jo-Anne Silverman has been hired and is beginning this work in September. Jo-Anne's professional experience includes fund development over many years, with United Way and Camosun College. She is currently working with elders through Serenity Home Care. Her knowledge of community resources, of the issues facing seniors, her listening skills and her genuine concern for others make her an ideal candidate for this role.

New Programs Coming in October Saanich Centre

Pop Art Portrait Workshop: Pop Art involves simplifying a portrait into tonal values using different colors and designs, like Andy Warhol's Marilyn Monroe. Regular practice will increase flexibility, mobility, agility, eccentric and isometric strength and endurance. As an added benefit, yoga fitness improves circulation and respiration due to the emphasis on the breath during the asanas. Thursdays starting September 10th from 9:15am-10:00am. The cost for 4 sessions is \$32 for members and \$37 for non-members.
