Ever try growing your own cherries?

Arch enemies are the starlings. In the river-marshlands of my youth, they used to attack ripening cherries in huge swarms and had orchard owners hire elementary school kids like me do the walking up one row of the big trees and down another, all the while cranking rattles to shoo the birds away. If truth be known, the wily starlings in their glossy flecked plumage and yellow beaks were just waiting to hear the scary rattles. It was the signal to come like a wheeling cloud, brush the trees above us and drive the attack. They'd usually take only one nip out of each black little cherry they uncannily found, so the sweetest cherries in the fruit picker's basket were those with old or fresh wounds.

Today's cherry growing is somewhat more sophisticated, I imagine, and the cherries are also definitely different: larger fruit, never in bunches of two, three or four, they have heathy and clean skins. They look as though they have been genetically modified. Amazing that such perfection has come about in a relatively few generations of cherry trees.

As you grab a handful to wash and make up a bowl of cherries, one thing hasn't changed: the anticipation of cracking with your teeth the plump and taut shiny globes. Your bowl now offers up a wide choice of glistening lovelies, and naturally, you go for the blackest and most voluptuous one first, then the second blackest, and the best looking cherry after that, and so on, and so forth. Funny thing is, with the champions gone, your appetite is undiminished. Because, of all the remaining cherries, there will be one that's the most desirable, most glorious of cherryhood until you reach the bottom of the bowl. Believe it or not, the last one is as good as the very first: glassy smooth in your

mouth with a firm skin and the pulp like a juicy bite from a fillet mignon.

Victoria Golden Rods and Reels Fishing and Social Club was honoured on Monday June 13 when it received a Saanich Environmental award. It was one of 7 awards given out at the Saanich Council meeting. They were recognized in the Volunteer

Organization category for their work on water quality research and stewardship at Elk/Beaver Lake.



Over the last 3 years the club has raised \$30,000 for

scientific studies of water quality issues and remediation options. Working closely with an Intergovernmental Steering Committee (BC, CRD, and Saanich) the club managed a dedicated group of volunteers from the fishing and rowing communities who have contributed over 2,000 hours of volunteer labour.
