Income Tax Volunteer - Narender



Narender is in his fourth year of volunteering at Silver Threads preparing Income Tax returns for people who qualify for the Community Volunteer Income Tax Program. Narender has prepared 220 returns and counting at Silver Threads! But the number of returns that he has completed is much higher than that as Narender used to

prepare taxes for UVic students and he has also been volunteering for 10 years at Saanich Volunteer Services Society in their tax program.

As well as an affinity for numbers, Narender also has an affinity for languages and speaks four fluently – English, Hindi, Punjabi and Urdu. He acquired those in his native India, which he left in 1967 to pursue a PhD in the USA. Narender moved to Canada in 1971 to do Post Doctoral work at UBC. Upon a job offer from the Provincial Government, Narender moved to Victoria in 1977 and spent the next 30 years working as a scientist in water quality.

Narender is now enjoying his retirement volunteering, travelling with his wife, and spending time with his two daughters and 3 grandchildren.
