

We are pleased to have her join our team!

The Senior Community Outreach Project is funded by the United Way Greater Victoria and the City of Victoria and operates in partnership with James Bay New Horizons and Silver Threads Service. The purpose is to reduce isolation of seniors and connect with those in the community who are not accessing service. Outreach Staff meet with seniors where they live mainly in rental housing, to make connections, listen to concerns and inform seniors of available services to help them remain independent. As we begin 2018 we will now have 2 staff, with Kristy working with Jo-Anne Silverman who has been with us since the project began in 2015. Our focus this next year will be to build connections to services for those seniors.
