# Happy New Year!

As we welcome 2024, we want to express our sincerest wishes for a prosperous and fulfilling New Year. May the year bring you abundant happiness and good health. We are excited and eager to have you return to the Centres, and we also extend a warm invitation to those who have not yet experienced Silver Threads to come and join our community. Silver Threads is entering our 68<sup>th</sup> year of service, having been incorporated in 1956. This is a good time to provide some background information about our organization. In BC, not-for-profits/non-profit organizations are known as societies. This means we are required to comply with the



BC Societies Act and have a Constitution and Bylaws. Societies (and Charities) use their funding to deliver on their cause.

We are also a registered Charity. In Canada, the Canadian Revenue Agency (CRA) approves charitable organizations and once approved, the organization must report annually on its finances and activities to maintain charitable status. CRA issues charitable registration numbers that allows the charity to accept donations and issue tax receipts. In 2023 we have issued so many tax receipts to our very generous donors, and we are grateful for your support. Our donations from individuals during our Direct Mail Campaign has raised \$17,000. Thank you to all, your gifts are appreciated.

Our fiscal year is April 1st to March 31<sup>st</sup> and aligns with the timing of our Annual Membership. Being a charity means that we have a diversified revenue base. In our last fiscal 23% of our revenue came from membership and program fees. The remaining 77% was raised through Municipal Grants, Island Health, Gaming and Foundations as well as individual donations. By having diverse revenue streams, it allows those we are serving to have low-cost programs and services. Happily, our membership and program dues will not be increasing in 2024 as our revenue remains healthy.
