Victoria Centre Update

Silver Threads is an integral part of the City of Victoria's decentralized service delivery model and serves as one of the eleven Community and Senior Centres in the City. As such, over the course of the past year, we have put the issue of the Victoria Centre funding shortfall in front of the City of Victoria Mayor, Council and Senior Staff repeatedly. We are the only organization not in a city owned building and as lease holders we must pay property taxes and operating costs that the other Centres do not. While we do receive an annual grant from the city these additional costs exceed what we are given. We respectfully requested the city revisit the agreement made in 2014 and help us find a solution to the \$50,000 annual deficit.

Our members and the organization acknowledge that a

community-based center is a significant resource that enhances the health, well-being, and safety of older adults. We hoped that the City of Victoria would also recognize the importance of this and understand that, with projected demographic shifts towards an increasing aging population, it is essential to secure services for both the present and the future.

With no action from the city, The Silver Threads Board of Directors and the Executive Director have made the difficult decision to try and continue services and find a way to address the ongoing operating shortage. Since COVID Silver Threads has increased in membership, programs, and participation making significant progress in building back bigger, better and more efficient than ever despite the challenges faced. We remain dedicated to sustaining this momentum and working towards continued advancements. As a charitable, not-for-profit serving the community for 69 years we are committed to supporting older adults remaining independent in the community.

It is important to understand that the impact of closing the Victoria Centre would have significant negative impact for the people who attend our programs and services and it would greatly impact the organization and the Saanich Centre as well. These facts were of critical importance in our decision making.

We are grateful for the support from our members and participants and the patience of our staff during these past months. We welcome the opportunity to revisit this situation at any time with the City of Victoria and are actively committed and working towards a sustainable long term solution. Income Tax Preparation

In March and April, Income Taxes for 2024 can be filed at both centres through the Canada Revenue Agency's Community Volunteer Income Tax Program (CVITP). Eligibility for Seniors 55+ includes having a moderate income (up to \$35,000 for a single person or \$45,000 for a couple) and a simple tax situation. Appointments will be in person and volunteers will be e-filing all returns. The service is free of charge, and you can book an appointment after February 18th

once you have all your relevant tax forms. Appointments at the Victoria Centre will be for members only.
